

## What curricula are used for Foundational Learning Competence?

Three documents describe the learning required:

- Foundational Learning Competence Part Qualification
  - In public comment until 4 August
- Foundational Learning Competence Communication in English: Curriculum Framework
- Foundational Learning Competence Mathematical Literacy: Curriculum Framework
- Provide detailed specifications of knowledge, content, applied skills, range statements and assessment requirements.



## Content of FLC

### Item bank development

- Item bank development
  - Training developers
  - Development and moderation of items
  - Trialling of items
  - Review of items after trialling
  - Included into the bank with relevant statistics
- Test development
  - Specification table developed and piloted
  - Stored items with relevant statistics retrieved as required

## What is the external assessment for Foundational Learning Competence?

The final assessment in each learning area consists of:

- 60 questions
- multiple-choice format
- 2,5 hours in length
- Across 3 levels: elementary, intermediate, advanced

## Is a multiple choice format appropriate for assessment of FLC Communications?

- Multiple choice testing is:
- efficient
- effective in assessing a wide range of knowledge, skills, attitudes and abilities
- Good question development, proper moderation produce probing questions: conceptual understanding, analysis and evaluation
- Skills required in writing
- Afternoon session



## Is there any assessment opportunity to assess writing skills?

- The IEB recognises the importance of extended writing in various forms
- It has undertaken the development of an assessment that focusses on writing, based on FLC curriculum
- Focus: report writing, summarising, evaluating and substantiation of a particular position
- Assessment details should be available in the next few months
- Not compulsory but available for those who want it

#### Learning assumed to be in place

A learner who is competent at ABET Level 3 in the learning area should be able to manage the FLC learning programme.



## Do all learners have to do the Foundational Learning Competence assessment?

- NSC learners i.e. since 2008, who passed both English and Mathematics or Mathematical Literacy
- The employer or training centre may require that learners complete the FLC assessment even if they have completed Grade 12
- People with a Grade 12 certificate prior to 2008 that does not include Mathematics will be required to at least do the FLC assessment for Mathematical Literacy
- Note: potentially negative impact on learning if a learner does not have a good understanding in FLC requirements

#### What is a Placement assessment?

#### A placement assessment

- designed to assess learner understanding and level of competence in the learning area across a range of competence levels
- Purpose: to determine the level of the learning programme into which a learner should be placed to continue learning effectively
- Safeguard intended to ensure that the demands of the learning programme match the learner's level of competence in the learning area.



## Who will provide the Foundational Learning Competence programmes?

#### The IEB will:

- Record a list of providers who offer the FLC learning programme
- database will be available on the IEB website (<u>www.ieb.co.za</u> under the Adult section)
- Those wishing to engage the services of a FLC provider should consult the database.



# Who will provide the Foundational Learning Competence programmes? Cont.

- Recording, not accreditation
- Process in folders: developmental
- Expertise in the teaching and management of provisioning in the learning areas
- Costs: R 500
- QCTO costs



# Where will the FLC external assessment be conducted?

- at IEB recognised assessment centres;
- Initially assessment centres will be available in major cities;
- gradually will be expanded to include out-lying areas;
- The IEB will place a list of assessment centres on its website (<u>www.ieb.co.za</u> under the Adult section)
- When registering learners, the appropriate assessment centre will be selected



# What are the criteria for an organisation to be recognised as an IEB assessment centre for Foundational Learning Competence?

#### Key criteria:

- Accessibility
- Health and safety
- Security
- Appropriate resources e.g. desks, chairs
- Public transport availability



# What is the difference between a recorded skills development provider of Foundational Learning Competence and a recognised IEB assessment centre for Foundational Learning Competence?

- Recorded FLC provider: provides the FLC learning programme in one or both of the learning areas e.g. learning material, facilitation for learners who wish to write the FLC external examination
- IEB recognised assessment centre: a venue at which the examination takes place.
- An organisation may be both a provider and an IEB recognised Assessment Centre.
